Incident Description: On Friday, October 8th at 1:49pm a male JCU student called JCUPD Dispatch and reported that about 45 minutes prior to calling (1:05pm), a man pulled up beside him in a white Mazda 3 sedan in front of the Food Service Loading Dock on Washington Blvd. The man asked if the student "wanted oral sex." The student replied no, and the man drove away towards Belvoir Blvd. The male never exited his vehicle and just spoke through an open window.

Description of Suspect(s): The suspect from this incident was described as a white male, about 40-50 years old, balding, and wearing a red t-shirt.

Additional Information: There was no further interaction between the student and the man in the car.

University Heights Police were notified, and a notice was also sent to area police departments to look for this vehicle. JCUPD and University Heights Police will be giving extra attention to the campus and surrounding areas.
